
### Parallel Circuits

## Mathematical Formulas



$$a^2 + b^2 = c^2$$

$$\sin \theta = \frac{a}{c}$$

$$\cos \theta = \frac{b}{c}$$

$$\tan \theta = \frac{a}{b}$$

Circumference of a circle =  $2\pi r$

Area of a rectangle = length × width

Area of a triangle =  $\frac{1}{2}$  base × height
